John B. Kilpatrick was a son of Bryan and Elizabeth Burney Kilpatrick of Pitt County. His two story home, still in good repair, stands on the South Side of Secondary Road 1919, 0.7 mile East of the junction with Secondary Road 1753, near St. Johns, Pitt County. This Bible, printed in 1848 by the American Bible Society of New York, was owned in 1985 by Mr. Alton Slade Chapman.

(buried St. John's Church; married Walter Gatlin Chapman; parents of Alton Slade Chapman)

Daniel Kilpatrick son of John B. Kilpatrick & Frances his wife was born Nov. 2, 1875
(buried Burney-Kilpatrick Cemetery; died as a young man around 1896)

Edward Kilpatrick son of John B. Kilpatrick & Frances his wife was born April 25, 1877
(buried Burney-Kilpatrick Cemetery; never married)

Lucy Kilpatrick daughter of John B. Kilpatrick & Frances his wife was born Nov. 27, 1878
(buried in a cemetery near Gardnersville, Pitt Co, grave moved; current location unknown; married Paul Moore)

Moses Kilpatrick son of J. B. Kilpatrick & Frances his wife was born Sept 28, 1880
(lived at Newport News, Va; married a lady from Newport News; was old when he got

married)

Emma Kilpatrick daughter of J. B. Kilpatrick & Frances his wife was born Dec. 30, 1881
(buried Riverside Church cemetery, married Sal ?? Worthington)

Isaac Kilpatrick son of J. B. Kilpatrick & Frances his wife was born March 2, 1883
(buried St. John's Cemetery; married Maggie Worthington daughter of Lemuel K.
Witherington)

Jesse Kilpatrick son of J. B. Kilpatrick & Frances his wife was born May 10, 1884
(buried Burney-Kilpatrick Cemetery; never married)

Paul Kilpatrick son of J. B. Kilpatrick & Frances his wife was born Sept. 1, 1886
(buried Burney-Kilpatrick Cemetery; never married)

Alton S. Chapman was born Oct. 8, 1901
(son of Walter Gatlin Chapman & wife, Lula)

Fannie Rhem Chapman was born Oct. 22, 1906
(daughter of Walter Gatlin Chapman & wife Lula)

W. G. Chapman was born Feb. 5, 1872 died in 1934
(buried St. John's Cemetery)
